DAILY INTERNAL INFO SUMMARY 09-15

SECOND BRIGADE ELEMENTS KILLED 25 VC ON SUNDAY IN LIGHT BUT STEADY CONTACT 14 KILOMETERS SOUTHEAST OF BEN TRE.

FOURTEEN OF THE VC WERE KILLED BY GUNSHIPS OF 3/5 AIR CALAVALRY, AND FIVE OTHERS WERE ACCOUNTED FOR BY THE AIR CAV'S GROUND ELEMENTS. TROOPS OF 3/47 INFANTRY KILLED FIVE ENEMY AND SEIZED A SUBMERGED SAMPAN CONTAINING A PAIR OF M-1 RIFLES AND ABOUT 150 ROUNDS OF AK-47 AMUNITION. THE OTHER ENEMY KIA WAS CREDITED TO GUNSHIPS FLYING COVER FOR THE INFANTRYMEN.

IN SOME OF THE MOST HEATED ACTION OF THE DAY, 16 NAVYMEM WERE INJURED IN TWO VICIOUS ATTACKS ON THE BEN TRE RIVER'S "AMBUSH ALLEY." IN THE FIRST AND MOST SEVERE ATTACK AT 1110,

THE BOATS OF RIV DIV 111 WERE MOVING SOUTH TO REACH 4/47 INFANTRY WHEN THEY WERE HIT WITH AUTOMATIC WEAPONS AND ROCKET FIRE FROM THE WEST BANK. MONITOR 111-3 TOOK A ROCKET IN THE COXSWAIN'S FLAT AND REPORTED EIGHT WOUNDED, INCLUDING THE BOAT CAPTAIN AND LT. CHARLES COX, THE EMBARKED DIVISION COMMANDER.

THE OTHER SEVEN NOW WOUNDED WERE ABOARD ATC 111-3 AND INCLUDED FOUR CREWMEN AND THREE UDT-12 PERSONNEL. SEVEN OF THE 15 KIA IN THE FIRST ATTACK WERE INJURED SERIOUSLY ENOUGH TO REQUIRE MEDICAL EVACUATION, WHILE THE OTHERS WERE TREATED AND RETURNED TO DUTY.

THE FIRE WAS RETURNED AND SUPPRESSED WITH ALL WEAPONS AS THE BOATS RAN THE AMBUSH AND CONTINUED TO THEIR OBJECTIVE BEACHES.

THREE HOURS LATER THE SAME BOATS WERE 200 KILOMETERS PARTHER DOWN THE RIVER WHEN THEY WERE HIT AGAIN WITH ROCKETS AND AUTOMATIC WEAPONS. THERE WAS ONLY ONE MINOR PERSONNEL CASUALTY IN THIS ATTACK AND THE ASSAULT CRAFT AND A HELICOPTER FIRE TEAM COMBINED TO SUPPRESS THE FIRE.
