THE ATTACK OCCURRED AT 0815 AS THE BOATS WERE MOVING TOWARD THEIR OBJECTIVE BEACHES. THREE OF THE WOUNDED WERE CREWMEN ABOARD ASPB 92-5 WHICH TOOK A B-40 ROCKET HIT JUST AFT OF THE 20MM MOUNT. A FOURTH MAN WAS WOUNDED ABOARD ATC 131-8 WHICH FOOK SHRAPNEL IN THE COXSWAIN'S FLAT.
