USS COLLETON (AFB-36) 1968 BASIC NARRATIVE

The USS COLLETON (AFB-36) a self propelled barracks ship, was built at Boston Navy yard, Boston Massachusetts. Her keel was laid on 9 June 1945, and she was first launched on 30 July, but she was not completed until September of that same year.

After twenty two years of deactivation she was towed to the Philadelphia Naval Ship Yard and within five months was specifically designed and extensively remodeled to serve the needs of the United States Army as a Command Control Center as well as a floating home, and was commissioned on 26 January 1967.

The COLLETON is 328 feet long with a 50-foot beam. Unlike a majority of Navy Ships she has a shallow draft of only 12-feet which gives her the crucial maneuverability needs for navigating the shallow rivers, streams, and canals that interlace the Mekong Delta.

Since the time of here arrival in Vietnam June of 1967 COLLETON has been operating with the Mobile Riverine Force in the Mekong Delta; River Assault Flotilla One.

The primary combat units of the MRF are the 2nd and 3rd Brigades of the U.S. Army's 9th Infantry Division and eight squadrons of River Assault Boats which at different times have been embarked aboard the COLLETON.

The COLLETON received a new Commanding Officer on 22 February 1968 when LCDR ALDRISON relieved LCDR BANBURY.

During the year COLLETON conducted many and varied operations throughout the Delta which required many transits to Con Thre, My Tho, Vinh Long, Can Tho, and Dong Tam meeting the immediate needs of the Army.

Also COLLETON, along with the Mobile Riverine Force, was doing her part by firing many rounds of harassment and interdiction fire on the south bank opposite of Dong Tam to thwart the Viet Cong Communist aggressors.

12 June Commodore R.S. SALZER, USN, CTG 117 came aboard along with Army elements and held brief on Riverine Operations.

COLLETON continued with these operations until 15 October when we left for Sasebo, Japan for a much needed yard and upkeep period. Arriving in Sasebo 25 October, and into dry dock number one on the 29th of that same month.

On the 23rd of November finished yard period and were underway for the "Delta" however a casualty in number two boiler required us to make a stop at Subic Bay, Republic of Phillipines.

Having completed repairs COLLETON was underway again on 14 December 1968 to the Mekong Delta, Republic of Vietnam.

On 16 December 1968 COLLETON rejoined Mobile Riverine Force at My Tho, to resume combat operations. Normal Riverine Assault Operations proceeded until the end of 1968 having embarked "Alfa" and "Bravo" Companies of the 4th Battalion 47th Infantry.
