I am looking forward to meeting each of you as we tour the country with the red-carpet debut of your documentary. We will be posting locations and times on our website and in our email list. If you are not on our email list, send me an email to let me know so that I can get you added.

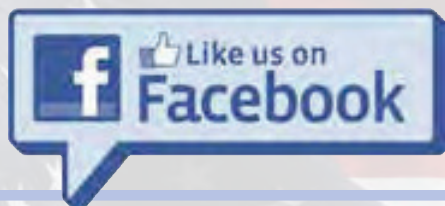
We are grateful to share that we still have a limited number of these posters available.

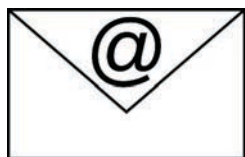

Afterward, Jeff and Shannon sold DVDs/Blu-rays along with posters, and members stayed to sign posters for those who purchased them.

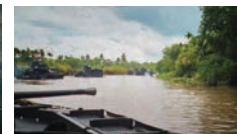
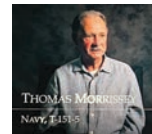
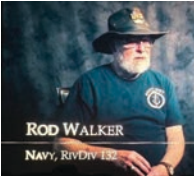
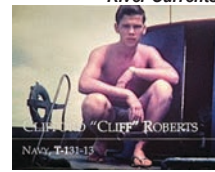
We captured a few screenshots during the screenings—sorry we couldn't get everyone in the shots!

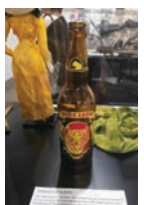
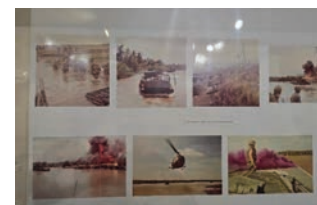

My Senior Advisor was big on birthdays. He thought of them as holidays that should be celebrated. So, he had me hitch a ride on an Army chopper to our main base in Dong Tam. This short trip took two days. After some harrowing events, I arrived in Dong Tam on 30 Oct 1970, my 21st year. I could vote! After returning to our Area of Operations in early November, all RAID-75 boats left for Dong Tam on 24 December. This was the last day we were involved in Tran Hung Dao VIII ops. Boats were still in transit on Christmas Day - just another day for a lone advisor on the canals and rivers with a South Vietnamese boat crew. When we departed Dong Tam for Ca Mau on 31 Dec 1970, I was assigned to T-11, aka HQ (Hai Quan) 1246. New Year's came and went as our boat was moored overnight at Can Tho. On 03 Jan 1971, we arrived at Ca Mau to participate in Tran Hung Dao XVII ops.

The holiday season was over. No Bob Hope. No bunnies. No chaplain's visit. No C-rats. It simply came and went. Christmas was to be found only in the individual advisor's memories and thoughts.

Veteran License Plates

We want all members of the Mobile Riverine Force Association—proud veterans of the Vietnam War’s riverine operations—to be aware that nearly every U.S. state offers special veteran license plates to honor your service. These distinctive plates not only display your veteran status with pride but often provide practical benefits like waived registration fees, tax exemptions, or disabled parking access. We encourage every member to research your state’s options through your local DMV website, county tag office, or veterans service officer—it’s a meaningful way to showcase your Mobile Riverine Force legacy on the road.

All 50 states and the District of Columbia provide military-related specialty plates, with designs varying by branch of service (Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Coast Guard), conflict era (including Vietnam-specific in many states), awards like Purple Heart, or disability status. Eligibility generally requires an honorable discharge, proven by your DD-214 form, and residency in the state. Some states, like Michigan and Indiana, offer branch-specific veteran plates with high popularity—Michigan reports over 26,000 Army veteran plates alone as of late 2025.

Purple Heart recipients qualify nationwide for dedicated plates, often free or low-cost, featuring the medal’s emblem. Many allow surviving spouses to retain them.



For 100% service-connected disabled veterans, benefits are especially generous: States like California, Texas, Georgia, Washington, North Carolina, Florida, Virginia, and Colorado often waive all registration fees, taxes, and even provide lifetime plates for one or more vehicles. These frequently include the international wheelchair symbol for handicapped parking privileges.

Vietnam Veteran Plates Overview. Most states offer dedicated “Vietnam Veteran” or “Vietnam War Veteran” plates. Common design elements include the Vietnam Service Ribbon (yellow with green and red stripes), American

flag motifs, POW/MIA symbols, or Vietnam-era imagery like helicopters. Proof of service typically requires documentation of the Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, or in-country service dates (generally February 28, 1961–May 7, 1975). Motorcycle plates are available in many states, and personalization is often an option.

Member Pete Bernier Remembers Chris Noel

I was very happy to see Chris Noel at our 2025 reunion in St. Louis. I am always happy to see Chris because she’s always had a special place in her heart for us Vietnam veterans.

These photos are from just a handful of times that Chris and I met. There were other events, always in support of Vietnam veterans, where Chris performed, and I always made sure to say “Hi.”

1969: I first met Chris at Binh Thuy, Vietnam on 4 July 1969. I had served in the MRF’s River Assault Division 112. By the end of June 1969, all of the RivDiv 112 boats had been transferred to the Vietnamese Navy. I was in Binh Thuy awaiting orders for my next assignment with the Naval Advisory Group Headquarters in Saigon. Chris had been invited to Binh Thuy to perform at a large promotion party for a senior naval officer. I met Chris at that party. Other than when I was in combat, I had my camera with me, and I was happy to get this photo with Chris.

2004: I once again crossed paths with Chris Noel on 30 May 2004 at the Rolling Thunder gathering near the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. My wife and I, typically with other family members, attended these yearly rallies as often as possible. We would watch and cheer the bikers (up to half a million, at several of the rallies) as they rode over Memorial Bridge and down Constitution Avenue in D.C. The bikers would then gather at the steps of the Lincoln Memorial for tributes to the POWs/MIAs/Vietnam veterans. Chris was there in 2004, and many other years. Again, I had my camera with me, and was happy to get this photo with Chris.

2025: I asked Eric Bowden, the photographer at our recent MRFA reunion in St. Louis in September 2025, to take this great photo of Chris and me. I didn’t have my camera, but Eric DID!

My military history books will probably go to the Naval ROTC unit library. After my friends have picked through my military gear, whatever is left that is relevant to Vietnam could go to Zion. Papers and letters related to my Vietnam service should go to the Texas Tech Vietnam Project.

Our daughter and granddaughters have no interest in military matters. My wife can keep whatever plaques, certificates, and medals she wants to display on the wall, along with her father's and my father's casket flags, pictures, etc. She can leave them to our granddaughters, who will likely stuff them in a trunk and throw them away after I'm gone.

Years ago, I reached out to the Texas Tech Vietnam Zumwalt Archives because I was wondering what to do with my 200+ slides and photos from my tour (December 1969 to December 1970). During that time, I traveled to 15 Navy logistics bases and was responsible for creating a plan to replace 9,000 U.S. Navy personnel with the appropriate number of Vietnamese personnel. Around 2018, I digitized most of them and have posted many on Facebook pages over the years. The archives staff said they would love to have them, would add them to their collection, and would create a CD or online repository. I have yet to follow through, but in my old age, I figure it might still happen.

The creators of the MRF documentary actually used two of my photos. During that year, I personally knew ADM "Bud" Zumwalt, but since my office was at Vietnamese Navy Headquarters in Saigon (HQVNCH), I much preferred my interactions with Đô đốc Trần Văn Chon, their CNO, over the U.S. leadership. My photos are of the people and places I visited, as well as the Vietnamese family who "adopted" me that year. When I left Vietnam in December 1970, they gave me all kinds of gifts, which we still treasure to this day.

Member **Leslie L. "Butch" Vorphal** passed away on October 15, 2025. While in Vietnam he served with Coastal Surveillance Force, Division 11 onboard PCF-3 in 1969-1970. Butch is survived by his loving wife Shirley.



Member **Charles James Beal** passed away on February 15, 2025. While in Vietnam he served onboard USS Tutuila (ARG-4) from April 1968 to April 1969. Charles is survived by Mary, his loving wife.

Member **William "Wild Bill" Sinclair** passed away on December 17, 2025 due to injuries received when he was struck by a vehicle. While in Vietnam LT Sinclair served as Executive Officers of the USS White River (LSMR-536) from September 1965 to February 1968. – "Wild Bill" Sinclair was quite a character. Meaning of "Fair Winds and Following Seas."

"Fair Winds and Following Seas" is a gesture of good luck to those we will miss and sailors who have served with honor and courage. The combination of phrases implies that a vessel will have good winds, and not have to pound into the waves. The phrase can be used as a toast or salutation between mariners. It is often used at a "beginning" ceremony such as a commissioning ceremony, as well as in retirement, change of command, or farewell ceremonies.

Following seas are defined by Bowditch's American Practical Navigator as *"A sea in which the waves move in the general direction of the heading"* and can be dangerous if the winds and sea are too strong. But the mariners' traditional blessing implies that both are comfortably rolling in the same direction as the boat.
